FAQ's for Racial Justice Work at RRUUC

How do I get involved with the Racial Justice Task Force (RJTF) or a Pathway?

The RJTF is comprise of three (3) RJTF co-leads plus two (2) co-leads from each Pathway. The implementation of racial justice work happens through the independent and aligned Pathways to Racial Justice. You are invited to attend any RJTF or Pathway meeting.

How do I know which Pathway to join?

Read the descriptions of the Pathways and choose the one(s) which sound like how you'd like to stand up for racial justice. Here is a list of the current Pathways to Racial Justice

- Actions 4 Justice: Increase RRUUC engagement in civic/policy actions supporting racial justice.
- Witnessing 4 Justice: Develops witness opportunities for RRUUC community (including <u>Black</u> <u>Lives Matter vigil BLM</u>).
- **Engaging Communities**: Develops opportunities for RRUUC to partner and ally directly with diverse communities.
- Families4Pathways to Racial Justice: Engage racial justice action through a parent and child/youth lens, accounting for different patterns of availability and developmental needs of children and youth.
- Supporting Educational Access: Supports fundraising, awards scholarships and partnerships with College Access and Beacon House.
- **Educating 4 Change**: Develops opportunities to increase personal self-awareness about racial justice through intentional learning and reflection.

How do I join a Pathway?

Currently, send an email to **Sheri Blanchette** and request to be put on the Pathway listserv.

What am I committing to when I join a Pathway?

Reading the emails from the listserv and deciding if the activities offered align with your interest and level of commitment. Attending scheduled meetings and staying engaged with the Pathway listserv are also expected.

Can I join more than one Pathway?

Absolutely!

What if I don't participate in any of the activities of a Pathway I've joined?

That is probably a sign that this isn't the right Pathway for you. Send a note to any of the RJTF leads and they will try to find a better fit.

How will I know what's happening in other Pathways?

Watch for regular Pathways news updates in the newsletter, Bulletin Board, or through the RJTF-News listserv.

What is the RJTF-News listsery?

Primarily a source of curated information about racial justice from many sources, including readings and videos, it also is used as way to distribute news about Pathways to those who may not yet be aligned with any one Pathway.
