- 1. Listening looks different on every person
- 2. Acknowledge and embrace the people who take everything literally
- 3. Many people need "fidgets" to concentrate.
- 4. Active breaks help everyone.
- 5. Make a schedule visible to everyone. Many people need help with transitions.
- 6. Social cues some people are naturally good at them, some people need to be gently taught.
- 7. Traits of neurodiversity vary widely. People with the same diagnosis can act very differently from one another.
- 8. Follow the lead of the neurodiverse student; believe them if they tell you that something in the class is bothering them (sounds, smells, etc.)
